Two years ago at Harding, some friends and I got into the business of collecting "coke points", which involved acquiring the bottle tops and cardboard box containers of any and every Coca Cola product we could find lying around. Now, when we would go on the hunt for these coke points, we meant business. We would scavenge the campus, plundering trash cans and scouring recycling bins, draining them all of every last coke point.



During one particular venture, we stayed after a basketball game and collected over 400 bottle tops from cokes that people had just thrown away!

Why would anybody go to such extremes for a few measly bottle tops? What would compel somebody to dig through trash cans for cardboard Coca Cola box containers? How often do you take advantage of opportunities in your life? When you're presented with an opportunity that would make you more successful in school, at work, etc., many of us may pounce on this offer immediately and seize this opportunity to get ahead.

But how many of us take advantage of every opportunity we have to share the gospel? After Jesus rose from the dead, he gave a command to His Apostles. "Go into all the world and preach the good news to all creation." (Mark 16:15). That is a command that each of us who calls himself a Christian must carry out. What is the good news? Listen to the words of Paul: "For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures."
