Our degree of generosity in giving may indicate that our attitude toward material possessions is not what it should be – 1 Timothy 6:17-19.

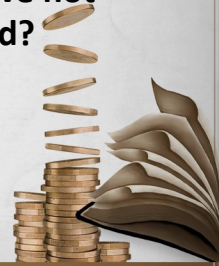
