
Introductory Thoughts

In this letter James reveals God's will on a number of important subjects that relate to Christianity.

In 2:14–26, James wrote about the relationship between faith and works.

This morning, we are studying the information revealed in 2:14–17.

The main point made in these verses is that there is no profit in having faith that is not accompanied by works.



2 Questions About Faith and Works - Verse 14

What profit is there for a Christian to claim to have faith that is not accompanied by works? – James 1:22–24 – James 1:25


Can faith that is not accompanied by works save anyone?

These 2 questions indicate that there is no profit or salvation found in faith that is not demonstrated by works of obedience. James Illustrated the Point Being Made - Verses 15-16

Suppose a brother or sister needs clothing or food.

The situation involves a Christian telling this needy person to depart in peace and to be warmed and filled, without supplying those things that are needed.

There is no profit in this for either person.
