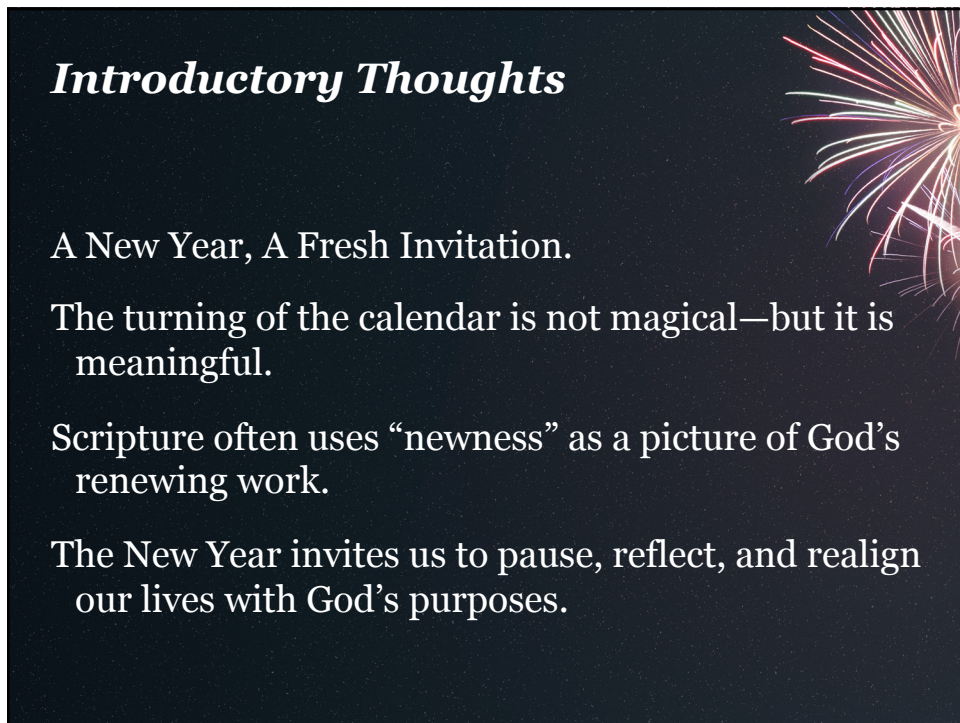

Step into the year with obedience even when the
path is unclear.

***Y — Yield to the Spirit —
Galatians 5:16–25***

The Christian life is not powered by willpower but by
the Spirit's work.

Yielding means surrendering control and following
His leading.

Focus on the Fruit of the Spirit.

Isaiah 41:10***

God's promises are anchors in uncertain times.

Abiding is the heart of spiritual growth.
