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Introductory Thoughts

Some of God's greatest assignments begin with our greatest insecurities.

When God calls Moses from the burning bush, Moses does not respond with confidence.

Moses feels unqualified, unprepared, and unable.

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Introductory Thoughts

But God does not begin His call with Moses' ability, he begins with His presence.

God does not answer Moses' insecurity with a pep talk; he answers it with a promise.

Moses teaches us that faith is not confidence in ourselves — it is confidence in the God who calls us.

God Calls Ordinary People to Extraordinary Purposes - Verse 11a

Moses sees his limitations; God sees His purpose.

Moses focuses on his past; God focuses on His plan.

God often chooses the unlikely, so His power is unmistakable.

God's call is not based on your résumé but on His sovereignty.

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Our Insecurity Does Not Cancel God's Call

Moses feels unqualified.

Yet God does not withdraw the assignment.

Feeling unqualified does not disqualify you — it prepares you to depend on God.

God's Presence Is the Answer to Our Inadequacy - Verse 12a

God does not promise Moses an easy path — He promises His presence.

God's presence is better than skill, strength, or confidence.

The success of Moses' mission depends on God with him, not Moses in himself.

Faith moves forward because God goes with us.

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***God Confirms His Call Through Obedience,
Not Feeling - Verse 12b***

The sign comes after obedience, not before.
God often confirms His call in hindsight.
Faith steps out before the evidence appears.
Clarity follows obedience — not the other way around.

***God Uses the Unqualified to Accomplish
His Purposes***

Notice what Moses becomes.
Not because he was qualified — but because he was called.
God gets glory when weak people trust a strong God.

Closing Remarks

Moses began with insecurity, but God answered with His presence.
Moses felt unqualified, but God promised to be enough.
Moses doubted himself, but God never doubted His plan.

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
